November 1, 1808 at Milnthorpe, England. Died July 25, 1887 in Kaysville, Utah

Marriages

- Leonora Cannon, January 28, 1833.
- 6 other plural wives

Baptized

May 9, 1836 with his wife in Black Creek, Georgetown, Ontario, Canada

Missions

1839 – 1841 to England
1846 – 1847 to England, again.
1849 – 1852 to France and Germany

Sustained as President and Prophet of the Church

October 10, 1880
